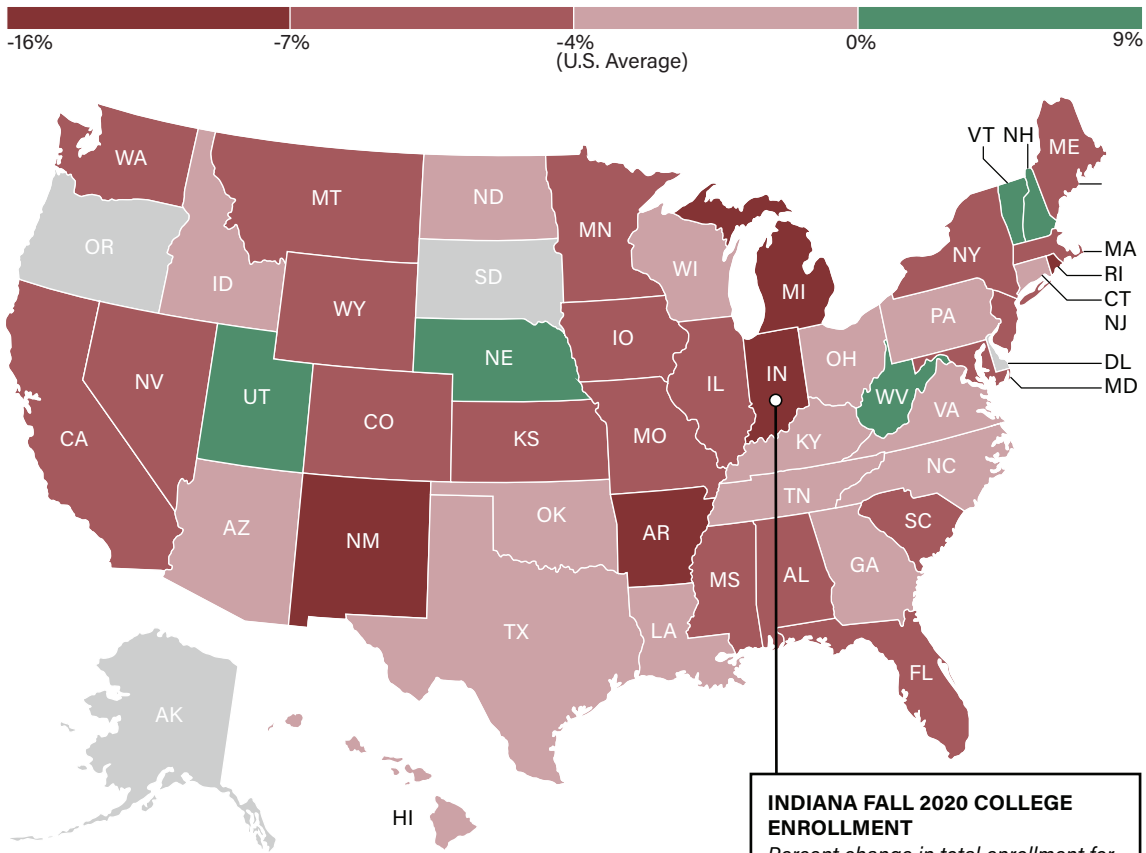


College enrollment dips in midst of global pandemic

After transitioning to online classes in the spring of 2020 due to COVID-19, colleges across the nation were forced to restructure their 2020-2021 courses to be taught remotely online. As a result, the United States saw 4% decrease in undergraduate enrollment this past fall from the previous year. Out of the 47 states in which sufficient data was available, only 5 of these states saw an increase in undergraduate enrollment. Indiana experienced the fourth greatest decrease in the nation with it's college enrollment falling 9.3%.

FALL 2020 UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLMENT

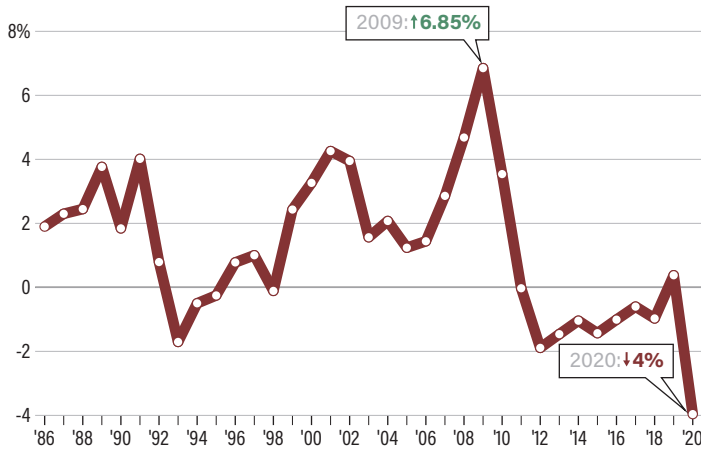
Percent change in undergraduate enrollment from Fall 2019 to Fall 2020 by state as of September 24.

UNDERGRADUATE FALL ENROLLMENT 1986-2020

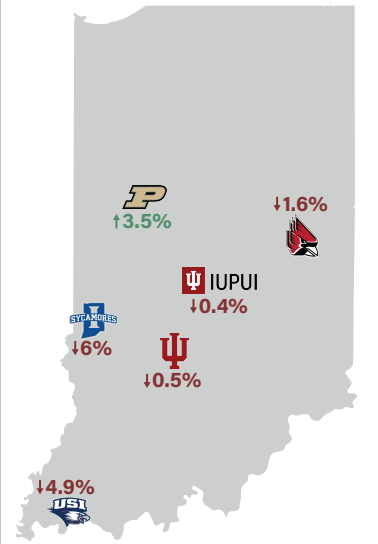
Percent change in total U.S. undergraduate fall enrollment from the previous year since 1986.
