#9WINDIANA? Where IU football stands all-time

After a 37-21 win against Rutgers, IU football moved up to No. 13 in the Associated Press Top 25 poll, their highest ranking since 1987 and only third week being ranked since 1994. The Hoosiers are playing an 8-game schedule this season due to COVID-19 and have won their first 2 games. Hoosier hopefuls started using the #9WINDIANA hashtag before a hopeful 2019 season, in which they finished 8-5. IU is a program struggling for relevance in a stacked Big Ten conference and in a state that is home to 8-time national champion Notre Dame. Since the AP started recognizing champions and doing weekly polls in 1936, IU has spent 58 weeks in the top 25 with zero championships.


Number of national champions by state since AP polling began

Notre Dame dominates the state over the past century

Despite their recent play, IU has not enjoyed the same success in the polling era as other other Indiana colleges. Notre Dame, which is tied for second-most championships since 1936, has spent 825 weeks in the top 25, and Purdue has almost four times as many weeks as IU.
